I have been glued to the Commonwealth Games cheering on our Australian team across the last fortnight. I must mention one event that I think typifies our school value.

Firstly, Liam Adams who finished fourth in the men's marathon. He is a self-confessed "weekend warrior" who balances a 40-hour electrician's work week with life as a marathon runner. The 35-year-old surged early in Saturday's marathon and led for more than 25km, ultimately finishing fourth – just seven seconds off a medal. He does not receive a shoe or clothing sponsor and works hard to support himself in his sport. Liam stated, "Hopefully all the weekend warriors, anyone working a nine-to-five who's battling with the work-running type of lifestyle, can look at that and find some inspiration. Liam displayed our value of responsibility by working hard and competing hard.

Hopefully our children will see that whilst medals are acknowledged, the values and effort that sit behind the medals are the things that we should truly celebrate.

Thank you also for your support over the past eleven and half years. It will be hard to leave Cloyna State School as I love my staff, families and students so much. As many of you know my mother has been fighting cancer for three years and the weekly travel back and forth to Brisbane has made it hard. 

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Term 3 – Week 2

#### The 2022 My Place Competition opens from 15 August.

The My Place television series, based on the classic picture book by Nadia Wheatley and Donna Rawlins, is a 'time machine' which takes audiences back into the past. It depicts the history of one Australian community through the eyes of the diverse children who lived there, highlighting the ways that people and places shape our personal, local and national histories. Drawing on the text's themes, the 2022 *My Place* Competition prompts students to reflect on change and continuity in their own evolving places and communities.

Jointly presented by the Australian Children's Television Foundation, ABC Education and Reading Australia, the 2022 My Place Competition is open to primary students in Years 1 - 6, secondary students in Years 7 and 8, and special education students of all ages.

The 2022 *My Place* Competition asks students to reflect on change and continuity throughout time in their own communities. Participants are invited to submit a short piece of creative writing that captures the history of their own local area and/or the people living there. This could include narratives, historical recounts, letters, diary entries, news reports, poetry, or other forms of creative writing.

Entries can be submitted through the competition page between 15 August – 16 September.

Winners will be announced in early Term 4.
