
Positive Behaviours Begin at Home

How do I help my child learn social skills?

- be a role model in your own relationships
- give children 2 things to choose between so they can practice decision making
- play games like Simon Says to practice following directions and listening
- prepare your child before changing activities—"It's 5 minutes to bedtime."

How do I help my child when they have started school?

Let your children know how precious they are to you and how much you value their education.

- · Read to them
- Have them read to you
- Prepare them well for school each day
- Listen to what they have done for the day
- Participate in school activities if you are available
- Keep communication lines open with the school
- Encourage effort
- · Answer their questions honestly
- Create learning moments in every setting
